Israeli Premier Yitzhak Rabin won a slim vote of confidence for leadership of the ruling party nomination. Rabin won by 40 votes. He said that he was looking forward to his visit to the United States and his meeting with President Carter next month.

A tanker collided into a bridge on Rt. 156 on the James River yesterday. The damage in property and the loss of lives has yet to be assessed due to the confusion.

The Coast Guard is still waiting to investigate fully the problem of oil leaking from a Liberian tanker with a cracked hull. The tanker, sitting 300 miles west of Honolulu, is carrying 30 million barrels of oil.

The violent actions in Uganda have received much attention from world leaders and now the UN Human Rights Commission has been asked to investigate the reported massacres of Christians and the murder of the Archbishop last week.

The Agriculture Department will abolish 11 of its 108 advisory committees for efficiency.
