

In the News

Secretary of State Cyrus R. Vance said Saturday that the 240 Americans in Uganda are safe and he does not believe the situation will develop into a crisis. Vance made the assessment following a meeting at the State Department with U.N. Secretary General Kurt Waldheim. Hundreds of Langi tribesmen suspected of plotting against Uganda's Pres. Idi Amin were strangled and clubbed to death on the night of Feb. 18 at Kampala's military police headquarters, according to a Ugandan refugee who said he was there.

The AFL-CIO called for an end to profit-making nursing homes last Saturday. They charged that older Americans living in nursing homes face widespread "patterns of abuse".

A full year after leftists abducted Ohio executive William Niehous, no word has been heard of his fate. Niehous had managed Venezuelan operations of Owens-Illinois Inc., the multi-national container company from Toledo, Ohio.

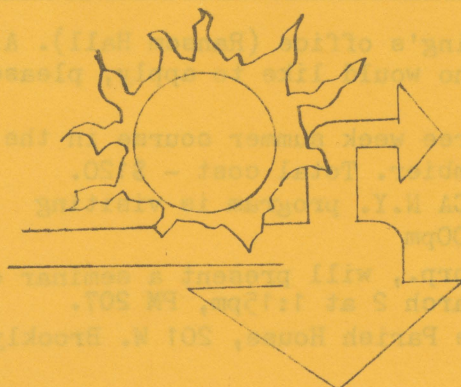

Lamps should be wiped clean at regular intervals to assure maximum efficiency. Lamps which are exposed to an atmosphere with substantial amounts of dirt, dust and other contaminants should be cleaned more frequently than lamps in a relatively clean atmosphere. Ceilings, walls, and floors should also be cleaned to improve reflective qualities. When daylight is used as a light source, windows should also be washed often.
