## In the News

The Penobscot and Passamaquoddy Indians will press a claim that 4 million acres in the interior of Maine were taken from them illegally in 1790. This claim is backed by the Justice Dept. but said it sould be settled in Congress, not the courts. The Indians have dropped their claim to 8.5 million acres of heavily populated land on the coast of Maine.

President Idi Amin, of Uganda, has postponed meeting with 240 Americans in that country for the second time. Amin continues to state that he summoned the Americans to thank them for their work and honor some of them.

Former Hitler deputy, Rudolf Hess, tried to kill himself last week in West Berlin's Spandau prison. At age 82, Hess is the only remaining prisioner at Spandau.

Robert Mardian, the former Assistant Attorney General whose Watergate cover-up conviction was overturned, was reinstated as a member of the Supreme Court bar.
