

In the News

The UN Human Rights Commission after four days of meetings has decided not to investigate alleged violations in Uganda. Meanwhile, Uganda broadcasted by radio that 2,600 mercenary troops were advancing to invade the country via Kenya.

Rescue workers probing a flooded mine shaft near Harrisburg, Pa. found the body of another miner. It is feared that seven other missing miners are also buried in the mine.

Negotiations over the control of the Panama Canal will resume next month.

The House assassination panel's chairman, Henry Gonzalez, resigned in a feud with its staff director. The committee may collapse with the House reluctant to extend funding.

Europe's Communists began a summit meeting in Madrid as chiefs of the Italian, French and Spanish parties gathered in the first such meeting in 40 years. They immediately called for the legalization of the Spanish party.

Governor Rhodes has introduced a bill to crack down on cigarette boot-legging in Ohio.

Rhodes says that the state loses 22 million dollars annually because of this problem.

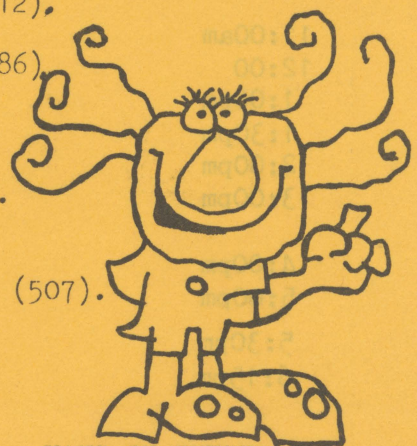
