## In the News

Friday's earthquake in Romania caused 746 deaths and injured 5,600 others. Hitting 7.6 on the Richter Scale, buildings shook from Rome to Moscow.

Defense Secretary Harold Brown reported that there are too many inefficiencies in the military system. After clearing up these inefficiencies, if there are still problems then Brown said that the US would have to seriously look into resuming the draft.

Henry Gonzalez, past chairman of the House Assassination Committee, said yesterday that "vast and powerful elements will prevent any meaningful investigation into the deaths of Martin Luther King and John Kennedy". Others feel that this Committee can make advances under new leadership. The House will consider these two viewpoints today.

In Tower City, Pennsylvania, the bodies of two more miners have been discovered. One man, buried for five days, was pulled to safety and is in critical condition. Rescue officials are not giving up hope for the five other missing miners.

Doctor Bernard is researching the possibility of transplanting the heart of a baboon into a human. This would be a temporary measure until an adequate human heart could be found. 


