In the News

Soviet Communist Party leader Leonid Brezhnev told Secretary of State Cyrus Vance that US-Soviet relations can't improve if the US meddles in Russian internal affairs. American officials assume that Pres. Carter's statements on rights of dissidents won't be an obstacle to progress in arms control.

Richard Nixon's attempt to bar public distribution of 30 White House tapes reached the Supreme Court. It agreed to decide whether the tapes played at the Watergate cover-up trial are part of the public record and thus may be reproduced and sold. Nixon says distribution

would violate his privacy.

The Defense Dept. authorized the armed services to upgrade as many as 432,000"undesirable" and "general" discharges given during the Vietnam era. Although those involved will have to apply to service review boards, persons in some categories will be reclassified automatically.
