

In the News

The Soviet Union turned down two American plans to limit strategic weapons without offering any new proposals of its own. Eight working groups were set up to deal with other US-Soviet issues. Carter remained hopeful that the two sides could reach an agreement.

More than 50 survivors of the plane collision in the Canary Islands were flown to the US for treatment, 12 of the most seriously hurt going to an Army burn center at San Antonio.

Former Senate Majority Leader Mike Mansfield is Carter's choice for ambassador to Japan.

Murders and muggings declined 10% last year, and the overall rate of serious crime reported to police didn't increase for the first time in five years. Only larceny was up, reflecting more thefts of CB radios.

Four sugar companies were indicted on federal charges of conspiring to fix prices of industrial cane sugar. The period investigated was from August 1972 until September 1973.
