In the News

Ohio House Minority Leader Charles F. Kurfess, R-Bowling Green, said Saturday he will seek the GOP gubernatorial nomination in 1978.

Two Pan American Airways jet freighters will carry the remains of the 323 persons who died in the crash of a Pan Am 747 jumbo jet in the Canary Islands to Dover Air Force Base. The freighters will bring the remains for identification at the base morgue, which was used extensively during the Vietnam War.

Egyptian President Anwar Sadat is expected to ask for US arms and for a detailed explanation of the administration's Middle East peace plans in his talks this week with Carter. Tornadoes touched down in at least four Midwestern states on Saturday causing heavy property damage and injuries to at least a dozen persons. Hardest hit was Kalamazoo Co., Mich.
