A Southern Airways DC9 was reportedly carrying 81 passengers as it crashed and burned 35 miles northwest of Atlanta. The plane hit stores and moving vehicles in its descent.

Castro was greeted by Soviet President Podgorny in Moscow yesterday to discuss their visits to Africa earlier this week. Both men called for a quick end to white-minority government in Rhodesia and South Africa, in contrast to British and American efforts to arrange a more gradual transition to majority rule.

Former Secretary of State Kissinger told a Senate subcommittee that unless the US stops squandering energy, the nation's foreign policy will be influenced by countries that supply our energy.

The Pentagon recalled Ret. General Andrew Goodpasture to take command of the troubled West Point Military Academy and reassigned its current commander, Lt. Gen. Sidney Berry. The Defense Dept. said no active duty officer was qualified and available for the post.
