Officials of the United Steelworkers Union reluctantly approved a new three-year contract last Saturday. The pact was described as a "major start" toward providing steelworkers with life-time job security.

In Israel Defense Minister Shimon Peres emerged Saturday as the ruling Labor party's choice for prime minister after his only announced rival withdrew from consideration.

Ugandan Justice Minister Godfrey Lule has defected to Britain, according to a Kenyan newspaper. The British Home Office in London confirmed that Lule is in Britain and has applied to stay longer.

In Pakistan police opened fire last Saturday on hundreds of antigovernment demonstrators trying to block swearing-in ceremonies for a provincial assembly in Lahore. Sixteen were killed.

Three men sought in last week's killing of West Germany's chief prosecutor, Siegfried Buback, have been seen in Sweden and a national alert has been posted. *******************************
