Moroccan troops have made their first move against an army of secessionist rebels in Zaire's Shaba Province.

State Auditor Thomas Ferguson wants Governor Rhodes to furnish information that can be used in billing natural gas utilities for Rhodes' gas-seeking trips last winter.

In Salt Lake City, army veteran Paul Cooper who may die any day from leukemia, is angered about the way the government treated veterans who were exposed to radiation. Cooper was granted \$820-a-month in disability benefits for his leukemia, which he claims was caused by a 1957 nuclear blast.

In Guam, three proposals to legalize gambling were overwhelmingly rejected with a 3 to 1 margin.
