The State Department claims reports that it has discussed the use of early warning systems to bolster the Mideast peace settlement are fiction.

The Supreme Court held that a state can't force automobile owners to display "ideological" slogans on their license plates. The court affirmed a lower court decision won by a New Hampshire couple who contend "Live Free or Die", the state's motto, violated their religious beliefs.

Black nationalist guerrilas in South-West Africa abducted 120 children and at least four white priests from a Roman Catholic mission school and forced most of them across the border into Angola.

Heart damage following a coronary attack apparently can be limited by administering an available drug within eight hours. A Boston study turned up the first strong evidence that G. D. Searle's Alidase, primarily used to increase absorption of other drugs, might be useful in treating heart attacks.
