

## In the News

Chicago police Saturday recovered a missing Illinois State Highway Toll Authority armored van on the Near North Side, minus nearly \$80,000 in coins and currency the van carried when it disappeared. The driver was found tied up in the back of the van.

President Carter's review of the Israeli-Arab conflict reaches its halfway point this week with a series of meetings with King Hussein of Jordan.

Oil well "blowout" experts flew in from Texas to try to cap a burst pipe spreading a huge oil slick in the center of the North Sea. Officials fear this could be Europe's worst oil spill disaster.

Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicles issued a reminder that motor vehicle owners whose last names begin with the letters A through K have until April 30 to renew their registrations.

A pipe bomb planted inside a workman's toolbox exploded in a locker room at Washington National Airport killing a janitor. The FBI is investigating the situation.
