The Washington Post and the New York Times released information yesterday that links Nixon much closer to Watergate. The new tapes discovered Nixon using such words as "Stonewall" and "hush money".

Ohio may be heading for a water shortage this summer. The low amount of precipitation this winter failed to fill the depleted ground water. Ground water levels are down one to five feet in places throughout the state. This shortage could result in less flow in the rivers and streams in the fall. Early conservation measures should be put into effect.
