

In the News

The United States and Vietnam opened talks yesterday in Paris in hopes of establishing formal diplomatic relations.

In the Pentagon, Harold Brown has ordered that the lines of production of the intercontinental ballistic missiles be kept in operation for at least the next two months. The missiles are being produced to insure the availability of spare parts and not to increase our weapon supply, according to Brown.

The Commerce Secretary warned that Americans should be less concerned about whether or not oil companies are profiting from oil import and concern themselves with conserving energy according to Carter's plans.

President Carter, in a telephone interview, said that he will promise Congress a fight if they insist on reopening Federal Water Projects.
