In the News

Striking Cincinnati teachers came back to the bargaining tables today after six days. The walk-out, seventeen days ago, involves more than three thousand teachers in the city. President Carter flew to London for a summit meeting with Allied leaders yesterday. There has been a recall of over 300,000 Mr. Coffeemakers because of improper wiring systems. At the National Conference of Roman Catholic Bishops, the bishops decided to re-investigate the Vatican findings on women serving as priests in the Church.

The Judicial branch of the government body approved the "Instant Registration" plan of Carter, which would allow non-registered voters to vote on the day of the election. The proposal now has to go before the full house for a final decision to be made.

Carter praised Nixon for "admitting he lied to the American people" but doubted that the confession enlightened the citizens of this country. ************************
