## In the News

Possible detente between China and the Soviet Union seems even farther away as relations between the two powers have hit a new low point after a bitter attack of China by the U.S.S.R.

President Carter won one battle with US Steel's compliance with his suggested limited 6 percent price increase, thus forcing competitive corporations to roll back their previously announced increases of 7 to 9 percent. However, he faces a tough battle with business leaders over his intended hike in Social Security taxes which would be greater for business than for workers.

Three years after the beginning of forced desegregation in Boston, tempers are still hot. However, the Columbus school board is calmly planning its program for a court-ordered desegration of its schools, while also hoping to improve educational quality.

In Youngstown, gunman Archie Nelson surrendered after his three hostages escaped. Blair dropped her two young children to FBI agents and safety then made a daring escape herself down a stairwell.
