

In the News

President Carter is expected to sign on Wednesday the two proposed Panama Canal agreements finalizing 13 years of American-Panamanian negotiations. The treaties will not become effective, however, until ratified by the Senate. Four state attorneys general are attempting to block the President's signing by a Supreme Court injunction: they fear higher shipping tariffs for their states and want the public first to be made aware of all details of the agreements.

For most of Ohio's cities, school desegregation will be delayed until January. Chief Judge F.J. Battisti of U.S. District Court declared that state school officials' intentional delays were primarily responsible for segregated schools. This fact, plus difficult bus ordering and scheduling and other court decisions, have hampered busing of school children, despite several suits by the NAACP to end desegregation.

Former President Nixon revealed in a recent television interview with David Frost that Henry Kissinger, then the national security advisor, had urged bombing several North Korean military airstrips in retaliation to an April, 1969 downing of a Navy surveillance plane, killing all 31 crew. Calling this Kissinger's first "hard line" attitude, Nixon rejected it, considering the larger Vietnam war enough.
