## In the News

Bert Lance resigned his position as Budget Director today due to, as he stated, "the amount of controversy and the continuing nature of it." Although no guilt of bank mismanagement has been proven of Lance, President Carter feels his very close friend has made the correct decision. Carter now begins the search for Lance's successor.

The Strategic Arms Limitation Treaty (SALT) signed 5 years ago between the U.S. and the U.S.S.R. will expire in 11 days apparently without a replacement agreement. The Treaty limits submarine-launched and land-based intercontinental ballistic missiles of both countries. Recent talks have been in a stalemate for 18 months.

Dr. Sidney Gottlieb, former CIA member, disclosed to a Senate subcommittee that some of President Nixon's 1971 traveling party were given drugs in an "unfriendly" nation. The former president, however, was apparently not administered any of the drugs.
