Another setback for President Carter's energy package has been the Senate's refusal to allow taxation on U.S. crude oil, which would add another 7¢ to a gallon of gasoline. Ohio's four major gas suppliers say there is little chance for a gas shortage this winter similar to last winter since their supplies have increased. Thus, the problem of closings of schools and businesses should not arise.
