In the News

With President Carter's energy program all but killed by the Senate, allies are building hopes on the House-Senate conference committee composing a compromise bill. Senate democrats hope for a plan to continue price regulation of natural gas and an energy tax bill compromising the wills of both the President, who proposes heavy taxation to conserve energy, and the Senate, which has refused to approve the taxes.

Despite Syria's pessimism and the PLO's refusal to accept the right of Israel to exist, there is a general feeling of optimism that the Middle East peace talks may occur before 1978. Israel has finally agreed that there ought to be "a Palestinian voice" in Geneva.

Hans-Joachim Bohlmann of West Germany has been apprehended in connection with the damaging by acid of paintings by Rubens and Rembrandt in various West German galleries. A man with obvious psychological problems, he declared, "I must destroy what other men cherish."
