## In the News

The two Soviet cosmonauts have returned to earth after another aborted attempt by their Soyuz-25 spacecraft to dock with the space laboratory Salyut-6. They were in orbit a little over 2 days. Problems stemming from an inadequate booster rocket for Soyuz and faulty equipment have plagued Soviet space attempts over the last decade.

Congress is moving on a bill to prohibit child pornography and to ban interstate distribution and sale of any such literature exploiting children under the age of 16.

The Nobel prize in physics was awarded to two Americans and an Englishman today. John Van Vleck of Harvard, Philip Anderson of Princeton, and Sir Neville Mott of Cambridge University contributed research on magnetic and disordered systems which has been applied to developments of lasers, in the use of industrial glass, and in birth control. The Nobel prize in chemistry was awarded to Ilya Prigogine of Brussels, Belgium for work in thermodynamics. Betty Williams and Mairead Corrigan of Ireland, founders of the Northern Ireland's Peace People, have been awarded the Nobel Peace Prize.
