President Carter's new Department of Energy has hired the accounting firm of Price Waterhouse and Co. to research a standby plan for gasoline rationing. Some fear prejudice and a conflict of interest on the part of Price since some of the largest oil companies also employ the firm. However, Energy Department officials state that no advising will be done by Price, only "legwork."

Another hijacking: Turkish and West German officials are trying psychologically to wear down the terrorists holding captive 87 hostages on a West German jet in Dubai, U.A.E. The hijackers are demanding \$15 million and the release of 13 terrorist prisoners held in the above two countries or they will execute their hostages and Hanns Martin Schleyer, kidnapped six weeks ago in Germany by collaborating terrorists.
