

**In the News**

Although terrorists claimed that violence has just begun, the West German government is waging a comprehensive manhunt with the help of the German people for the 16 terrorists who kidnapped and killed industrialist Hanns-Martin Schleyer. Some recent violence has erupted from the belief that the Bonn government killed the 3 imprisoned terrorists after the failure of the Lufthansa hijacking. However, officials say they were suicides. A lone hijacker commandeered a Frontier airliner in Nebraska Thursday and forced it to fly to Kansas City where he allowed all but 11 male passengers and 4 crew to deplane. Thomas Hannon demands \$3 million, weapons, and release of an Atlanta prisoner. Prince Charles of England has arrived in this country to tour several U.S. cities. He is presently in Chicago being escorted by Mayor Michael A. Bilandic.
