A May 4th Coalition rally Saturday on the Kent State University camous protesting the building of a gymnasuim near the sight of the 1970 shootimgs ended in violence and arrests. Police using clubs and tear gas broke up the prohibited rally by protestors who want history remembered. University officials want the gym question settled; the controversy has contributed to a decrease of enrollment from 20,000 to about 15,000 students.

David Berkowitz, suspected Son of Sam killer, has been deemed fit to stand trial. He is pleased with the decision and upcoming trail where he can tell his story about the angelsturned-howling demons who urged him to commit the murders. He adds he is ready to die for his crimes.
