The Senate, attempting to put together a final energy proposal, is trying to settle on the Carter-proposed taxes to force energy conservation or the Senate Finance Committee-approved tax incentives which would reward saving. President Carter opposes the latter idea, saying that they would benefit primarily the energy-guzzling oil industry.

U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations Andrew Young stands in favor of U.N. proposed sanctions against South Africa in the form of arms and investment embargoes. South Africa has angered blacks and the world alike in its latest series of outlawing black organizations and newspapers and arrests of dissenting blacks.
