

In the News

About 500 angry farmers protesting low farm product prices congregated in Washington, D.C. this past weekend via tractor. Primarily they seek 100% parity prices, which would guarantee their farming to be economically profitable. They threaten to strike December 14 unless Congress and President Carter, absent over the weekend, offer help.

A total of 120 out of 235 American prisoners have so far been repatriated from Mexican jails during the last week as part of a new prisoner exchange treaty between the U.S. and Mexico. Only some Americans held in Mexico, mostly drug offenders, are eligible to return here, and there have been many happy reunions with families before the prisoners are taken to a local U.S. jail. Many will be paroled almost immediately. The Americans have told of torture and harrassment in Mexican jails, and most Mexican prisoners here are not volunteering to be repatriated. Only 36 Mexicans have been returned to their homeland.
