Peace talks in Cairo, hopefully preliminaries to a Geneva conference, opened amid optimism and cordiality among the four representatives. Israel, Egypt, the U.S., and the U.N. are negotiating, while Syria, Jordan, Lebanon, and the PLO are boycotting the talks. Israel hopes for a comprehensive peace agreement with all Arab entities, not just bilateral peace with Egypt, which Arab critics figure may happen.

As friends and relatives mourn the dead of the plane crash that killed all 29 of the Evansville, Indiana basketball team, coaches, and supporters, officials are trying to understand the reasons behind the crash. Hazardous weather and perhaps engine trouble are obvious contributing factors.
