In the News

Rep. Al Ullman, Chairman of the House Ways and Means Committee, feels President Carter's tax cut of \$25 billion is too high considering the nation's higher-than-expected economic recovery. He thinks the tax cut would more than offset new energy and Social Security tax increases and would be inflationary.

Dr. Jonas Salk, who pioneered the polio vaccine, has developed a new drug which may arrest multiple sclerosis, a debilitating and often fatal disease of the nervous system. The FDA has given Dr. Salk permission to test the drug, a myelin basic protein, on humans suffering from MS; Dr. Salk cautions that the experimental research, still in its early stages, may not be successful.

At the end of 1977, the unemployment rate dropped to its lowest point in over three years: 6.4%.
