

In the News

Senator Hubert Humphrey lost his battle with terminal cancer, and his body was flown to Washington, D.C. to accept honors normally reserved for heads of state only. His body lay in state Saturday and Sunday morning in the Capitol Rotunda. A congressional ceremony, attended also by Richard Nixon, was at 11:00am Sunday. Humphrey was flown back to Minnesota for more personal tributes Sunday and for funeral services today in St. Paul. During his final years, Humphrey had become even more of a beloved, trusted, and admired political figure; his friends now seek to remember him with joy instead of sorrow.

Egyptian President Anwar Sadat spoke in harsh and pessimistic terms regarding the stalemate in the Middle East peace talks. He feels Begin is not fully cooperating and compromising. Sadat expresses no hope for advances in Monday's political committee meeting in Jerusalem between Israel, Egypt, and the U.S. Secretary of State Vance will attend this meeting.
