

In the News

In the first group of astronauts named since 1969, six women, three blacks, and a Hawaiian oriental were listed among 35 candidates to fly with the Space Shuttle operation beginning in 1979. Many are research specialists for the Shuttle; one is a pilot.

The Supreme Court is now hearing two Ohio cases which pose many ethical questions regarding the death penalty. The answers may restrict or broaden the use of capital punishment, which the Court declared valid in 1976 if applied in certain instances.

Amid economic chaos, high unemployment, and near political civil war, Italy is looking to form her 40th government since 1943. Premier Giulio Andreotti, a Christian Democrat, has resigned his government, but possibly could be asked to form another. The communist camp may bargain for a coalition with Andreotti although the United States demands that the communists be kept out of any governing body.
