In the News

Prime Minister Begin of Israel is claiming that Egypt's stubborn attitude over Palestinian self-determination and Jewish occupation of the Sinai, among other points, has caused the suspension in the peace talks. President Sadat of Egypt is announcing the same grievance, saying talks will resume only when Israel changes her position. Begin feels the U.S. will not pressure him into sacrificing his position. Israeli Foreign Minister Moshe Dayan and U.S Secretary of State Vance still seem optimistic for reaching peace; they indicated this time is just one of the "ups and downs" of international negotiations. President Carter has selected U.S. Circuit Judge William H. Webster of St. Louis to replace Clarence M. Kelley as FBI director. Webster must win Senate confirmation before succeeding Kelley. Webster has not yet been formally notified; Carter was to announce the appointment Thursday.
