In the News

To be announced today along with details of President Carter's 1979 budget will be a loan guarantee program to buoy up the aging domestic steel industry. The loans, up to \$500 million, will permit some firms to keep production going, while allowing others to modernize and update the plants. Hoping to prevent unemployment in areas where plant phase-out had been planned, the government also hopes private investment will support the project.

President Carter has submitted a tax plan to Congress which attempts to simplify and justify our tax system while keeping the economy running smoothly. He plans personal tax cuts for those earning less than \$100,000 per year and sizeable cuts for all corporations.

Also in the plan are a myriad of revenue-raising tax revisions.

Kodak has been convicted of monopolizing the amateur photography industry after losing a court suit with Berkey Photo, Inc. of New York. More suits are planned against Kodak, possibly one by the federal government.
