

In the News

President Carter's 1979 fiscal budget just tops \$500 billion, including a record \$60.6 billion deficit. Carter has just about reneged on his promise of a balanced budget by 1980, saying that his \$25 billion tax cut for individuals and corporations plus the deficit spending should keep the economy running smoothly. Higher employment and a moderate, steady growth rate of 5% per year are his top goals. Carter hopes to initiate a new tax cut in 1980 - just about the time of possible reelection.

A wealthy industrialist was kidnapped in Paris on Monday, while his chauffeur was severely beaten and cast aside into a truck. Baron Edouard-Jean Empain, one of Europe's richest businessmen, was abducted for monetary or political reasons; his family had not, as of Tuesday, heard from his captors. Empain is head of a conglomerate which originates France's sole nuclear power output and many other manufacturing interests.
