

In the News

Ohio is slowly digging out from one of the worst blizzards in our winters' history. Highways were closed in a total of 39 counties, and thousands left helpless from the storm are still being housed in 195 Red Cross shelters throughout the state. 20 federal disaster squads have come to help on a county-by-county basis after President Carter declared Ohio a disaster area. There have been 18 known deaths from the blizzard and untold millions in losses to commercial businesses and farmers. Food shortages exist due to impassable snow and ice-choked roads; farmers have lost livestock and have dumped milk, unable to transport it to market. Farmers will be eligible for low-cost federal loans to reimburse some of their losses. Meanwhile, road crews continue to plow out the state.

Professional kidnapers who abducted European industrialist Baron Edouard-Jean Empain last week are after a \$10-20 million ransom. Political motives have been ruled out due to the lack of publicity sought by the men. A handwritten letter, an ID card from Empain, and a fingertip supposedly cut from Empain's left hand have been sent as proof they have Empain. So far, no ransom has been paid.

President Carter has invited Egyptian President Anwar Sadat to this country February 4 for extended talks concerning the future progress of the Middle East peace negotiations. Carter and Secretary of State Vance also want to be assured that Egypt is willing to pursue the extensive and difficult negotiations in order to achieve peace. Carter wants assurance, too, that Sadat will follow previously-decided procedures instead of compulsively changing plans, such as the withdrawal of his entire delegation from talks in Israel. Israeli Prime Minister Begin plans a trip to the U.S. in April coinciding with the 30th anniversary of Israeli independence. Some speculate that, after Sadat's visit, Begin will come sooner than April.
