

In the News

While the United Mine Workers continue their 59-day old strike for higher wages and complete restoration of pension and health benefits, coal piles across the country are dwindling down to less than a 2-month supply for most urban areas. Many states seek conservation by consumers, and Columbus has turned off night street lights. A strike lasting longer than 25 more days may mean loss of electrically-generated water supplies, heat, and all business services, and will generate massive unemployment among public utility workers. President Carter spoke Wednesday night directly to the people hoping to swing public opinion toward support for passage of the Panama Canal Treaties. Proponents of the Treaties now hope for a flood of supportive letters to Congress. Senator Robert Byrd (W.Va.) felt there will be "a shifting of sentiment" toward approval while Senator Robert Dole (Kan.) felt that the President was "not very convincing."
