

In the News

An agreement between the negotiators for the United Mine Workers and the coal industry has the potential to end the 63-day national coal strike. The agreement outlines wage increases of 37% over the next three years for coal workers. Pensions and health benefits are to be restored and guaranteed and are to be administered solely by the coal industry. The pact must now be approved by a previously-divided 39-man bargaining council - not a certainty at all. Afterward, the striking 160,000 coal miners must vote to approve the pact.

Egyptian President Anwar Sadat is frustrated by what he terms Israel's "old tactics and worn-out ideas" and says there would be "peace in less than a week" if Israel would return occupied land to the Arabs and leave Jerusalem an open city. Sadat has offered no Arab concessions and wants the U.S. to put pressure on Israel to be first to yield to keep the talks open. Meanwhile, Congress is about to receive an Egyptian request for purchase of a squadron of light military bombers.

Muriel Humphrey, wife of the late Hubert Humphrey, has been sworn in to fill the vacant senate position of her husband. She intends to continue on his pending legislation but has no plans as yet to seek an elected term after her 10-month appointment expires.
