With the national coal strike lingering on into its 69th day, the East Central states are preparing for power sacrifices and hardship. President Carter has declared Ohio in an energy emergency situation; 95% of the state's electrical output is generated by burning coal. Ohio only has a 34-day supply of coal remaining, making industrial layoffs and shutdowns imminent. It will take about 3 weeks after a strike settlement to ratify the pact and begin mining operations.

The town of Hidden Springs, California, is missing in the wake of a disastrous flood caused by unceasing rains Friday. Survivors of the little town, advertised as a place for "trout fishing, camping, picknicking", are looking for missing or dead relatives and their property which were lifted by the flooding river nearby and carried down the canyon.
