## In the News

In his fourth appeal to President Carter since the end of January, Governor James Rhodes asked to have a three-member mediating panel meet with the coal industry and the United Mine Workers union. Ohio and many other states now face serious power shortages and thousands will be laid off their jobs, including the auto plant workers, if the strike is not settled immediately. Currently, Labor Secretary Ray Marshall is trying to prod the miners' bargaining group and the coal producers back to negotiations. United Mine Workers President Arnold Miller is a troubled man pressured heavily from the union to gain a satisfactory settlement, the White House to achieve a quick settlement, and an angry coal industry which feels he is asking too much. He fears for his life, knowing a

growing constituency seeks his resignation; Miller says he will never resign.
