

## In the News

Labor Secretary Ray Marshall is frustrated by the coal union's rejection of a proposal which "seemed to be industry's final one." During the latest negotiations Saturday, the coal producers presented a very reasonable contract which the union negotiators accepted, with one addition. The industry refused the new proposal, and the talks broke down. President Carter says he will step in if necessary and is considering three options: possible federal confiscation of the mines; binding arbitration; and invoking the Taft-Hartley Act, which might be ignored by the miners.

W.A. "Tony" Boyle was convicted Saturday of first degree murder a second time for instigating the slaying in 1969 of Joseph Yablonski, his competition for the leadership of the UMW. An appeal of his first trial countered that Boyle had not been able to offer a full defense; his first conviction was overturned in 1977.

President Carter is contemplating a mandatory federal health insurance for all Americans. Insurance would be purchased from either the government or private companies at competitive prices. HEW would regulate the insurance industry to provide for adequate coverage for all.
