An agreement Sunday between the United Mine Workers union and an independent coal producing company may be the catalyst toward ending the stalemate between the UMW and the coal The pact also lessens pressure on President Carter to intervene directly in Coal analysts feel the coal operators will be induced to follow the lead of previous agreements. Secretary of Labor Ray Marshall is contemplating a temporary contract covering agreed-upon issues and return to work order for the miners, while the most difficult issues are ironed out later during further negotiations.

The Senate Tuesday closed its doors to the public during the Panama Canal Treaties discussion.

The talk centered on charges that Panamanian leader Omar Torrijos has been smuggling drugs.
