President Carter and Labor Secretary Ray Marshall are trying to regroup following the Bituminous Coal Operators rejection of another contract proposal by the UMW. While the attempt to settle the 80-day coal strike continues, the National Guard is trying to insure all movements of independent coal; and the threat to thousands of jobs looms larger.
