In the News

President Carter and Labor Secretary Ray Marshall are trying to regroup following the Bituminous Coal Operators rejection of another contract proposal by the UMW. While the attempt to settle the 80-day coal strike continues, the National Guard is trying to insure all movements of independent coal; and the threat to thousands of jobs looms larger. Robert Hermann, held captive in a roadblocked car by Byron Ball after the latter robbed a bank, grabbed Ball's gun during police negotiations to end an ordeal begun Tuesday afternoon.

Hermann's two children had also been held but were released by Ball in exchange for another getaway car and a 45-minute head start from police. Hermann was not injured during captivity
