The College intends to resume classes after spring vacation on Monday, March 20 as scheduled.

The key factor in determining the final decision will be whether or not the miners ratify the coal settlement. If the miners do ratify the contract by March 13, the College definitely will reopen on schedule.

If the miners do not ratify, there is a possibility that the Ohio Power Company will impose a curtailment upon the College's electrical usage that would force us to consider the feasibility of reopening. With this uncertainty, arrangements have been made for a special telephone line (614-427-3500) open 24 hours a day, that will be in operation during the second week of vacation, March 13 to 19. Students are encouraged to call this number if they have questions about the College's plans for reopening.

Our current voluntary curtailment of electrical usage in College buildings will remain in effect throughout this week.

## In the News

While the national rank and file coal miners are being briefed on the proposed UMW contract, Ohio locals are already complaining of lack of benefits for the miners. They find many loopholes in procedures for absenteeism and in allowing the coal companies to fire wildcat strike leaders. Miners are not happy with deductibles for company-run health care and are arguing a contract they feel should be exactly what they want, considering they have waited so long. Most of the nation-wide ratification voting will be done this Saturday and Sunday. Ratification is, by no means, a sure thing at this point. Congress will shortly receive President Carter's proposal for continuing the Elementary and Secondary Education Act which will emphasize basic education and the "3 R's". Spending will increase 15% for public education through high school, and a separate Department of. Education is hoped to be established.
