In the News

As the coal strike moves into its 105th day, coal miners look backward with pleasure as a federal judge refused to reinstate the ignored Taft-Hartley back-to-work order and are looking ahead now to voting Friday on the latest contract agreed upon last week. The fine print is being read, and there is no guarantee of passage. Primarily, the miners complain in this contract of the company-run health plan for which they must now pay deductibles. A picture of kidnapped Aldo Moro, alive and presumably well, was released Saturday by his captives, the terrorist Red Brigade of Italy. Claiming he is the original oppressor of Italy as leader of the Christian Democrats, Moro will be held for trial before a "people's tribunal". Moro was abducted last Thursday in Rome, and his 5 bodyguards were murdered. The Israelis continue their guerrilla push into Lebanon to secure a "security belt" between the Israeli border and Lebanon. They seek to end Palestinian terrorist attacks such as the
