Talks between Israeli Prime Minister Begin and President Carter ended with little resolved except a feeling here that Israel would end its occupation of Lebanon when UN peacekeeping forces were settled in. Begin refused to promise removal of Israeli settlements on the west bank of the Jordan River; consequently, the US is at a standstill as to how to resume Middle East peace talks between Israel and the Arab nations.

A circus institution is gone. During a circus promotion Wednesday in San Juan, Puerto Rico, Karl Wallenda fell 120 feet to his death from a high wire strung between two buildings when the wind unexpectedly rose. As is its tradition, the circus began on time that afternoon —with prayers said by the entire crowd for the 73 year-old Wallenda, the greatest of a family of high-wire walkers who have been thrilling crowds for decades.
