

In the News

57% of the nation's coal miners voted Friday to accept the national coal contract, ending the 110-day coal strike and guaranteeing no massive employment cut-backs in other industries. Many Ohio utilities ended all power conservation measures immediately, while others are waiting to see how soon the coal begins returning to the plants. Some mines may still be closed today due to a still-unsettled Associated Bituminous Contractors pact affecting 10,000 mine constructors. Short-term effects of the strike will disappear fast; however, in the long run, declining coal production is the problem plaguing the industry.

Fearing rising oil prices due to the dollar's decline in value, President Carter is beginning a week's goodwill tour to four countries to discuss US oil imports, human rights, and majority rule. Carter will visit Venezuela, Brazil, Liberia, and Nigeria.
