## In the News

Now that the coal miners are back to work, the one legacy of the coal strike that remains is the excessively high cost to consumers of electrical power purchased to replace power from coal. Its goal is to do more in the cities with what the government has already given and proposed, including job programs, public works, and grants. Many feel the program faces a tough fight in Congress.
