President Carter won much applause during his speech in Lagos, Nigeria when he declared the U.S. favors "an Africa that is at peace, free from colonialism, racism, and military interference." Regarding the last criteria, Carter denounced Cuban and Soviet military presence in Africa.

Ohio, lying on the eastern edge of "Tornado Alley", is entering the tornado season; 80% of the fierce storms occur in April and May. Yearly, Ohio usually hosts about 13 tornadoes, most of which come from the southwest or west. Under a "tornado warning" where a funnel cloud has been sighted, adequate cover is essential, preferably shelter in a basement or near an interior wall of a building.
