

In the News

Over 200 unemployed youths from Cleveland will begin a bus march to Washington Friday to decry their plight of wanting and searching for work for years but always being turned away. Their seemingly hopeless and frustrating situation is shared by almost 50% of the 16-to-19 year-olds, or an estimated 25,000 Cleveland youths.

The House investigation into Tongsun Park's financial contributions to 32 congressmen in the early 1970's has revealed that Cleveland Congressman Minshall and Ohio State Senator Lukens have possibly received undocumented sums from the Korean rice agent. Park is co-operating fully with the investigation and insists that he was acting not as a representative to the South Korean government, but as an investing businessman.
